#### **Assignments:**



##### **'Peer-to-Peer Training' for "Awareness Programme regarding Placement" Report**

All the placed students of BE IT formed the 5 groups to cover important topics for the preparation of Campus Placement, Aptitude, Technical, HR Interview, Code to Code Round, Company wise hiring trends. Each group prepared PowerPoint Presentations. The peer-to-peer training for **SE students** was scheduled on **20th April, 2024 in classroom 205**.

An aptitude test is an important part of the screening process for potential employers. They focused on Logical reasoning, Verbal Ability, Numerical Ability, Abstract Reasoning, Spatial reasoning etc. They also covered guidance for group discussions, as this round is conducted in the selection process for trainees and executive positions to mainly check team playing skills for working in organizations with people.

During the Technical sessions the important topics of Data Structure and Algorithms, Object Oriented Programming, Database Management Systems, Computer Network, Operating System were discussed. Questions asked in the technical round were discussed. What are the important points to consider while giving technical interviews were fully explained by BE IT students. How to solve the particular questions into the given time period.

Further, they elaborated how every company conducts an HR interview round to judge your personality, your strengths, your weaknesses, your capability to handle the role, to check your background, and to understand if you're the right fit for this job. The guidance for general questions like Tell me about yourself, why are you interested in this position? Were given.

The Code To Code session included demonstration of online programming platforms like Hackerrank , Code Chef, Geeks for Geeks, Prepinsta , LeetCode etc. for logic development and programming practice. These sessions were indeed useful for SE students for the preparation of Company placement.

In the Company specific session, the one placed student from each company of BE IT has given a presentation on the recruitment process of each particular company. The hiring trends in companies like Amdocs, Capgemini, IBM, Accenture, BNY Mellon and FIS were explained by BE IT students. Also the general questions were asked by SE students and they were answered by BE IT students.

**Peer-to-Peer Training' for "Awareness Programme regarding Placement" Report**

The peer-to-peer training for the students was scheduled on **20th April, 2024 in classroom 206**. All placed BE IT students for giving guidance to the **TE students**. BE students prepared presentations covering these topics in detail.

**Aptitude Round Session:**

An introductory session highlighted the importance of aptitude tests for students and the role of aptitude to get students placed. Students learned about essential skills evaluated in these tests, including logical reasoning, numerical ability, verbal reasoning, critical thinking, problem-solving, and data interpretation. Real-world examples were used to illustrate the relevance of these competencies. Effective strategies for improving performance, such as time management and question prioritization, were also discussed. The complete session was taken by Namrata and Shital from BEIT in which they shared their own experience and the experiences of their friends too. The entire session was very meaningful and informative. This involved discussing time management, question prioritization, eliminating wrong answer choices, and utilizing shortcut methods where applicable. TE students collaborated and shared resources, discussed challenging topics, and issues they face while solving aptitude questions.

Later on after completing the session, a question and answer round was taken in which TEIT students were able to clear all their doubts and got to know about the insights of the placement procedure.

**Coding Round Session:**

A 'Code to Code' session was organized to ensure students fully grasp the significance of coding rounds and are adequately prepared for them. Initially, an introductory session was conducted to

explain about the coding and how this round is conducted BE students have elucidated the purpose and structure of the program, emphasizing why aptitude tests are pivotal for employers and how they meticulously assess candidates' suitability for specific roles. TE students were thoroughly briefed on various aspects of coding rounds that assess adaptability, creativity, and the ability to think outside the box, all of which are highly valued in the tech industry. They also mentioned the importance of coding rounds and how to do coding to get hired. They received in-depth insights into common coding problems, comprehensive preparation tips, and effective strategies to enhance problem-solving skills. Additionally, discussions were held on online coding platforms and resources for supplemental learning, providing students with further avenues to strengthen their skills. BE students also contributed by sharing recommended platforms and resources based on their own preparation experiences. The peer-to-peer training played a crucial role in not only improving students' understanding but also equipping them with the necessary skills to excel in coding assessments. They also explained how to build logic and keep yourself tracked to get hire packages.

This session was conducted by Prajwal, Nupur, Neha and Shrushti. They shared their own experience, what were the challenges they faced throughout their journey. The roadmap given by BEIT students was truly helpful and their strategies will surely help TEIT students.

#### **HR Interview:**

In an 'HR Interview' session, students gained valuable insights into the significance of HR rounds and how to prepare effectively. The introductory session covered the reasons why employers place high value on personality assessments, including strengths and weaknesses. TE students were introduced to behaviour prowess evaluation, which assesses a candidate's adaptability, creativity, and alignment with the company's work culture. Practical tips for handling common HR questions, improving communication skills, and utilizing online preparation platforms were shared. Additionally, BE students recommended specific resources that proved helpful during their own preparation. Some of the common HR questions discussed included self-introduction, motivation to work for the company, strengths and weaknesses, self-rating, significant achievements, future goals, and reasons for hiring.

During the session they asked a few questions to the students of TEIT to answer them and make the understanding of how the HR interview really works. The final round is the HR round and how to get yourself hired at this very final and crucial step, and the insights about this round was shared by Gauri, Krishna, Janavi and Sayali. How to answer? How to behave? What should I say? What not to say? These all questions were answered by them. Their HR interview experiences were really inspirational. Also the more stress was given on communication skills and soft skills. How it helps students to get hired easily.

### **Technical Interview:**

This session provided practical tips and strategies for tackling technical interview questions, coding challenges, and other aspects of the technical round. The guidance on how to approach problem-solving, effective coding practices, and common pitfalls to avoid were given.

During the session, BE students shared practical tips and strategies to excel in the technical round of placement interviews. They presented PPTs covering topics such as data structures, algorithms, object-oriented programming, databases, operating systems, and networking. TE students benefited from online resources, textbooks, and peer-recommended study materials to gain a comprehensive understanding of these subjects. Additionally, they learned about the importance of communication skills and staying updated with the latest trends, tools, and technologies in their field. By leveraging the knowledge and support of their peers, TE students gained confidence and insights to tackle technical interview questions effectively. Overall, the session provided valuable preparation for TE students, empowering them to excel in their upcoming placement interviews. Company Wise Hiring Trends, type of questions and requirements shared by them. This helped students to get ideas about the companies and how to prepare for them?

This session was taken by Anam, Vaishnavi, Samruddhi, Saraswati. Their own experience was really inspirational and very much to gain from that.

### **Company Wise Hiring Trends:**

During the session, BE students offered company-specific preparation strategies for placement, drawing on their own experiences and insights. They emphasized the importance of researching the company, understanding its culture and values, and aligning one's skills with its requirements to stand out among other applicants. Additionally, students from BE IT who had been placed in various companies, such as Amdocs, Capgemini, BNY, Parker, Accenture, FIS, Barclays, IBM, Standard Charter and Persistent, shared insights into the recruitment processes and hiring trends of these companies. They stressed the need for thorough research on the company, studying its website, annual reports, news articles, and industry trends. Furthermore, BE students shared their interview experiences, including types of questions asked and specific competencies assessed. They mentioned that soft skills play a key role in this complete process. They also provided guidance on maintaining a professional online presence, networking strategies, and building a strong personal brand. Having a good LinkedIn account is also very important as mentioned by BEIT students. Through this session, students gained practical insights from their peers, enabling them to tailor their preparation strategies for specific companies effectively. This session was conducted by Kalyani, Nikita, Sharwari, Shruti and Swapnali.

## **Coding round:**

The Coding preparation session aimed to equip SE (Second Year Engineering) students with essential skills and knowledge required for Coding Round in Placements. The session ensured practical insights and relevance to current industry expectations.

The session covered a comprehensive range of topics, providing a solid base for tackling coding challenges:

- **Importance of Coding in Placements:** The session presented by Manasi Kharadkhedkar kicked off by highlighting the significance of coding skills in the placement process. Additionally, practical tips and strategies for preparing for the coding round were provided.
- **Overview of Basic Programming Languages:** Presenter Shivangi Harge gave a foundational review of core programming languages like C, C++, and Java was conducted. Key concepts like variables, data types, control structures, and functions were revisited to solidify understanding.

Presenter Dhanashree Kadam took the initiative to explain the logic behind few codes and also emphasized on building logic for writing code. She shared her journey from starting coder to excelling it. Recognizing the value of practical application, she stressed the importance of undertaking projects and internships. She mention few basic and advance level websites for problem solving and regular practicing of coding such as geeksforgeeks, hackerrank and leetcode. She emphasized on regular problem solving and atleast solving 300 problems till the end of third year.

To ensure clarity and address lingering questions, a dedicated Q&A segment by Sanika Salunkhe concluded the session. This interactive format allowed students to clarify doubts and seek additional guidance on specific coding concepts and challenges.

## **Aptitude Round:**

During the session a particular emphasis was placed on the aptitude round, where the student presenters provided in-depth guidance on key topics frequently encountered in placement exams.

### **Specific Topics and Presenters:**

- **Boat and Stream; Trains:** Covered by Anuja Kadam
- **Profit and Loss, Time and work:** Covered by Sanjana Khadkabhavi
- **Simple Interest, Logical Reasoning:** Covered by Avantika Bhosale

Beyond theoretical knowledge, the session offered invaluable practical insights. The presenters generously shared sample questions encountered during their own placement rounds, along with their personal experiences overcoming challenges. They also made themselves to guide the students by solving the questions on board to explain the concepts. Further books written by R.S. Agarwal were suggested for practicing questions. Also websites such as Indiabix were provided.

The presenters accentuated on solving club activity questions. They mentioned how the Aptitude, coding and HR clubs helped them with their placement preparation right from beginning. They mentioned how solving topic wise questions on the clubs helped clearing their concepts and improving their math, solving techniques and speed per question.

The session further empowered attendees by providing links to helpful online resources for targeted preparation based on individual interests.

The combination of targeted subject-matter focus, practical problem-solving strategies, and real-life experiences provided a comprehensive and actionable roadmap for success in the upcoming placement season.

## **Group Discussion Round:**

The session delved into the first round, the Group Discussion (GD). This round assesses crucial skills like leadership, communication, problem-solving, interpersonal skills, and teamwork. The presenter: Khushee Mittal offered valuable insights on how to effectively present yourself in a GD setting, including:

- **Positive Approach:** Maintaining a constructive and optimistic outlook throughout the discussion.
- **Confidence:** Projecting self-assurance and a belief in your ideas.
- **Initiating or Concluding the GD:** Demonstrating leadership by starting or summarizing the discussion effectively.
- **Active Listening:** Paying close attention to other participants' points and building upon them.
- **Postures and Gestures:** Using appropriate body language that conveys confidence and engagement.
- **Sticking to the Topic:** Staying focused on the central theme while contributing relevant points.

The presenters also provided examples of frequently encountered GD topics, including:

- **70-hour Weekly Work for Corporate: Pros and Cons** (Discuss the potential benefits like career advancement and drawbacks like work-life balance)
- **Growing Threat of Digital Payment Frauds** (Explore solutions and emphasize user awareness)
- **Future of VR Technology** (Consider its potential applications and ethical considerations)

The importance of mock GDs was emphasized as a way to refine these skills. To illustrate these points, a few students were called out to participate in a live GD on the topic "**The Impact created by celebrities on the Lives of Teenagers.**" This practical exercise allowed participants to observe effective communication strategies and teamwork in action.

## **HR Round:**

The session also explored the HR round, where companies assess candidates for:

- **Integrity:** Honesty and ethical behavior.
- **Communication Skills:** Clear and concise expression.
- **Confidence:** Self-assuredness and a positive attitude.
- **Optimistic Attitude:** A proactive and hopeful outlook.
- **Empathy:** The ability to understand and share the feelings of others.

The presenters shared valuable tips for the HR round, including:

- **Researching the Company:** Understanding the company's values, mission, and recent developments.
- **Understanding the Job Description:** Tailoring your responses and highlighting relevant skills and experiences.
- **Practicing Common Questions:** Preparing for frequently asked HR interview questions.
- **Highlighting Skills & Experience:** Demonstrating how your skills and experiences align with the job requirements.
- **Enthusiasm & Genuine Interest:** Expressing genuine enthusiasm and interest in the position and company.
- **Asking Questions for the Panelist:** Preparing thoughtful questions to demonstrate your engagement and interest in learning more about the role and company.

By incorporating these insights, participants gained valuable knowledge on how to excel in the HR interview.

## Technical interview:

Targeting Second Year Engineering (SE) students, the session aimed to equip them with the necessary skills and knowledge to confidently navigate technical interviews on their path to becoming IT engineers. Final-year BE (Bachelor of Engineering) students who had recently secured placements shared their valuable insights and practical experiences, ensuring the guidance aligned with current industry expectations.

The session covered a comprehensive range of topics, providing a strong foundation for technical interviews:

- **Basic Programming Languages:** Presenter Vaishnavi Jagdale gave a review of fundamental programming languages like C, C++, and Java solidified core concepts like variables, data types, control structures, and functions.
- **Object-Oriented Programming (OOP) (Kalyani):** Presenter Kalyani Ralebhat delved into core OOP principles such as encapsulation, inheritance, polymorphism, and abstraction. Real-world examples illustrated how these concepts are applied in practical scenarios.
- **Database Management Systems (DBMS):** Presenter Saee Kad gave an introduction to DBMS covered relational databases, SQL queries, normalization, and ACID properties. The session emphasized the importance of structured data management in software development.
- **Data Structures (DS) and Algorithms (ADS):** Presenter Shruti Singh emphasized on the importance of efficient data structures and algorithms in problem-solving was explained, along with discussions on common data structures like arrays, linked lists, stacks, queues, trees, and graphs.
- **Computer Networking Fundamentals:** Presenter Shruti Singh shared basic concepts of computer networking, including the OSI model, TCP/IP protocol suite, IP addressing, and routing, were covered. Understanding these fundamentals is crucial in modern software systems.

Recognizing the value of practical experience, presenter Vaishnavi Jagdale stressed the importance of undertaking projects and internships. All the presentors shared their own experiences and highlighted how these opportunities played a critical role in their career advancement.

For core companies such as Uno minda and Spark minda Vaibhavi Jarande and Medhavi Purandik suggested girls to prepare their subjects such as signals&systems, control systems and principle's of communication system very well. They asked the girls to be through with the basic concepts of digital circuits, to be familiar and have good knowledge about basic gates and universal gates. They informed the girls about these questions being asked for both the online test round and interview round.

To ensure clarity and address any lingering questions, the session concluded with a dedicated Q&A segment. This interactive format allowed SE students to clarify doubts and seek additional guidance on specific technical topics.

## Company specific preparation:

Shedding light on the specific requirements and expectations of various prominent companies, eight presentations were delivered, each focusing on distinct companies, their recruitment processes, and the essential criteria for securing internships or placements.

- **Capgemini:** Presenter Shruti Singh highlighted Capgemini's global leadership in consulting, its core values, and the eligibility criteria for potential candidates.
- **VI:** This session by Akansha Prajapti and Aprita Jadhav delved into VI's academic requirements, emphasizing the importance of telecommunication subjects and the intricacies of their recruitment process.
- **Publicis Sapient:** Presenter Yashashri Nagargoje provided insights into Publicis Sapient's focus on digital business transformation, stressing the importance of aligning with the company's core values and understanding its services.
- **Western Union:** The recruitment process at Western Union was discussed by Yashashri Kulkarni. She emphasized the importance of clarity in fundamentals and proficiency in pseudo codes.
- **Uno Minda:** This presentation by Shweta Shivale and Sayali Kshirsagar explored Uno Minda's recruitment process, internship skills, and valuable resume preparation tips.
- **Spark Minda:** Presenter Priti Tarate and Dhanashree Rathi shared the unique aspects of Spark Minda were highlighted, including its high female employee ratio and same-day offer letter policy.
- **IBM:** Presenter Dhanashree Kadam shared the complexities of IBM's placement process were elucidated, equipping students with the necessary knowledge to navigate it successfully.
- **Amdocs:** Insights were provided into Amdocs' hiring procedures by Manasi Karadkhedekar. She emphasized the significance of database management basics and SQL proficiency.

They also shared their CV's used for the placements. The presentations equipped them with the necessary knowledge and skills to effectively navigate the recruitment processes of these esteemed companies. Key takeaways included:

- **Academic Excellence:** Maintaining strong academic performance plays a crucial role in attracting desired employers.
